

Hulas Infra *Powers Progress*

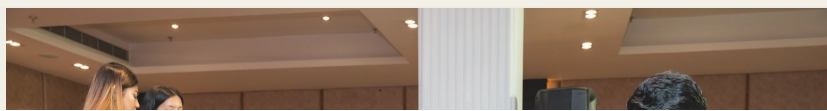
Inside the day Kathmandu University School of Management brought 150+ leaders, policymakers, and rising entrepreneurs together — and the infrastructure partner that helped build the platform.



CEO Conference 2026 was never just a stage for seasoned executives. It was built, deliberately, as common ground — where **industry veterans and first-year students** could sit in the same room, ask the same hard questions, and leave with the same sense that Nepal's business future is a shared project. Chief Guest Dr. Gunakar Bhatta and Keynote Speaker Mr. Vishnu Kumar Agarwal set the intellectual tone, offering candid perspectives on Nepal's economic trajectory, leadership under pressure, and the entrepreneurial instincts the moment demands. An academic presentation on the Nepalese business environment grounded the conversation that followed, giving students and executives alike a shared vocabulary for the discussions to come.

03 The Panel Discussion

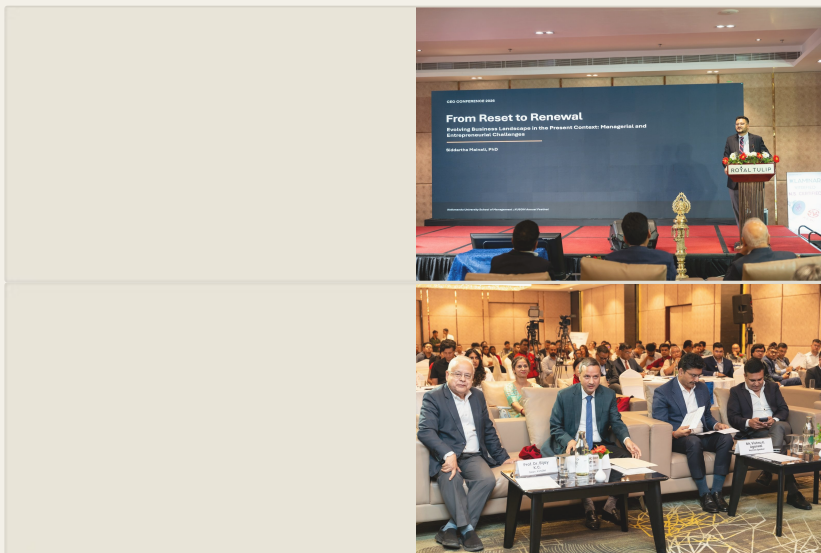
The conference's center of gravity was an 80-minute panel bringing together leaders from manufacturing, finance, entrepreneurship, and business management. Under Ms. Mathema's moderation, the discussion moved past platitudes into the real managerial and entrepreneurial friction of operating in Nepal today — and the audience Q&A that followed turned the panel from a
